COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is intended to train students in successfully facing the challenges of a freshman-level college composition class. Therefore, students will be required to write six different essays or compositions covering all rhetorical modes. Additionally, students will engage in the study of different literary genres, such as the short story, poetry, drama, as well as the study of English grammar to prepare for the ACT and college reading and writing.

## COURSE POLICIES:

- 4- Each assignment must follow the designated format. No plagiarism of somebody else's work will be allowed. In case plagiarism occurs, the plagiarized assignment will automatically receive a failing grade.
- 5- Contingent upon the level of performance, students will be assigned to work with a tutor in the Media Center, which also contains additional computerized resources. Using these resources will contribute to the improvement of writing skills.

- 2-2 (two) examinations (midterm and final)---20% overall.
- 3- Reactions to readings in the form of quizzes and other assigned classwork (10%).

- 2- Center the title of your essay
- 3- Double-space after the title before typing the text of your essay

- 4- All essays handed in should be in Microsoft Word format or other compatible format. Always save your work under RTF (rich text format) to ensure compatibility.
- 5- Staple essays of more than one page. When rough or previous drafts are handed in, please put your final or most recent draft on top and staple all drafts together.
