COURSE DESCRIPTION: An advanced course in essay writing with emphasis on formal research, Advanced Writing is designed to assist students in selecting appropriate data and critically analyzing that data, in order to produce formal college-level essays. In addition, this course will serve to develop proficiency in the collection and selection of data as applied to the written completion of a substantial and voluminous research essay. Finally, the course will aid students in becoming proficient in the use of the library in the entire research process.

COURSE POLICIES:

- 4- All essays handed in should be in Macintosh computer-generated format and double-spaced to allow sufficient space for revision and comments. You may work on your essays using IBM compatible computers, but please make sure to translate your files back to Macintosh for classroom work and printing.
- 5- Staple essays of more than one page. When rough or previous drafts are handed in, please put your final or most recent draft on top and staple all drafts together.
